The Fund employs a long/short investment strategy in an attempt to achieve capital appreciation and manage risk. The Fund takes long positions in securities Otter Creek believes to be undervalued and short positions in securities Otter Creek believes to be overvalued. The Fund's objective is to provide long-term capital appreciation.

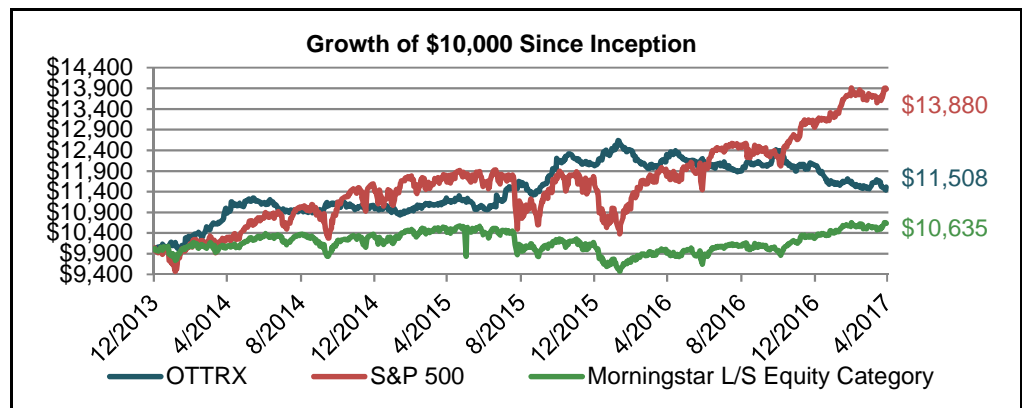

The Fund's investment adviser has contractually agreed to waive a portion or all of its management fees and pay Fund expenses (excluding acquired fund fees and expenses ("AFFE"), interest, taxes, interest and dividend expense on securities sold short and extraordinary expenses) to cap the fees at 1.70% for the institutional class and 1.95% for the investor class until at least February 28, 2018. The expense ratios that an investor would pay as per the previous prospectus were 2.79% gross and 2.76% net for the institutional class and 3.09% gross and 3.06% net for the investor class. The expense ratios are based on the estimated amounts and may not reflect the actual expense ratios.



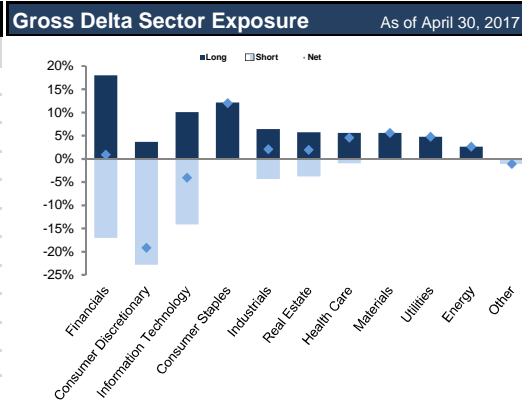

Month End Attribution

The Otter Creek Long/Short Opportunity Fund Institutional Class appreciated 0.35% in April. The S&P 500 was up 1.03% during the month. For the month, the portfolio's delta adjusted exposure was slightly net long. Our long portfolio appreciated 1.5% while our short portfolio (inclusive of puts) detracted 1%.

The largest winner for the month was our long position in PayPal Holdings Inc., which added 0.44%. PayPal rerated higher post earnings on the back of continued growth and market penetration. We continue to maintain a large position, yet have reduced the position back to approximately 4%, the position's size in the portfolio prior to the stocks recent appreciation of approximately 15%. The largest detractor during the month was our short position in Caterpillar Inc., which subtracted 0.36%. Since reporting earnings, amid signs of a pick up in global growth, we have significantly reduced our short position in Caterpillar. The largest contributor on the short side during the month was our short position, via puts, in IBM which contributed 0.17%.

From a high level, the performance of the fund versus the S&P 500 during the month was primarily driven by gains in our longs and losses on the short side of our portfolio. Additional contributors on the long side included Calavo Growers, Alphabet, and Thermo Fischer contributing 0.33%, 0.27% and 0.20% respectively. Recently, we reduced our exposure to Alphabet after reporting a well received quarter.

Portfolio Level Commentary

Since the end of March, we have continued to reduce our gross exposure slightly from 144% to 139%. Our net long exposure slightly increased from approximately 6.5% to 9.7%, delta adjusted, during the month. In aggregate, our put exposure represents roughly 2% of capital.

During the month we did not add any new long ideas as valuations have become less compelling, in our view. In fact, we have used the most recent appreciation in several of our long names to realize some gains and reduce our exposure to those companies. As we digest the most recent earnings results we believe there could be potential opportunities in areas such as healthcare, energy, agriculture and companies we believe will benefit from an improving global outlook.

Although our short portfolio has clearly been a meaningful detractor over the past several months, we continue to have high conviction in our current short ideas. Recently, we have been adding short exposure in areas that may be adversely affected by tightening credit standards such as large ticket consumer goods and deteriorating foot traffic trends in the retail space.
