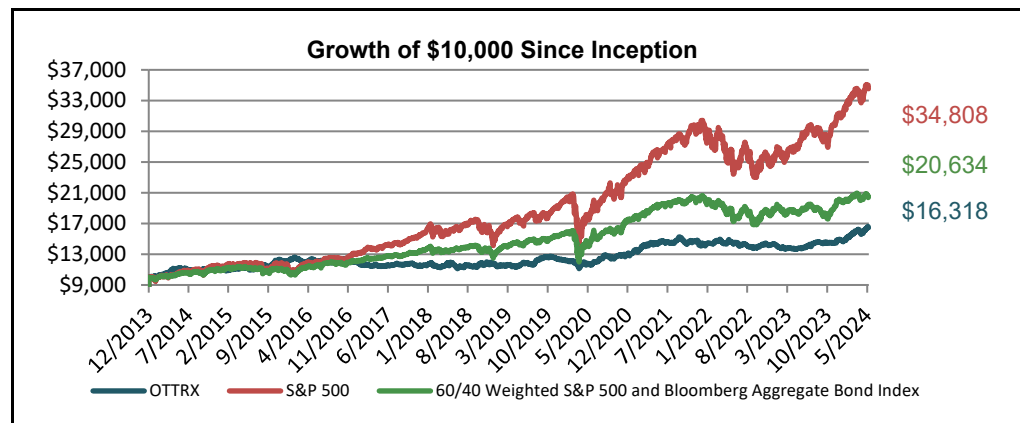

The Fund's investment adviser has contractually agreed to waive a portion or all of its management fees and pay Fund expenses (excluding acquired fund fees and expenses ("AFFE"), interest, taxes, interest and dividend expense on securities sold short and extraordinary expenses) to cap the fees at 1.55% for the institutional class and 1.80% for the investor class until at least February 28, 2025. The expense ratios as per the prospectus were 2.22% gross and 2.06% net for the institutional class and 2.47% gross and 2.31% net for the investor class. The net expense ratios are applicable to investors. The expense ratios are based on the estimated amounts and may not reflect the actual expense ratios.



Month End Attribution & Portfolio Commentary

For the month of May, the Otter Creek Long/Short Opportunity Fund gained approximately 3.62% while the S&P 500 appreciated 4.96%.

At month end, the portfolio's delta-adjusted exposure was approximately 57.0%. As shown in the table above, our gross long equity exposure (delta adjusted) was 93.1%, while our gross short equity exposure was -36.1% (delta-adjusted).

During the month our long equity positions gained 4.5% while our short equity related positions, including put options, lost -1.0%. Our largest contributors were Nexttracker (long), Vestis (short), and Vertiv Holdings (long). We covered our Vestis shortly after they reported disappointing earnings. Our largest losers were Deckers Outdoor (short), Target (long) and Blackstone (short). After reporting disappointing earnings, we sold our Target position and reallocated the capital to more attractive risk adjusted opportunities. We were pleased to generate nearly 80 basis points of alpha on the short side during the month while in the heart of earnings season.

Despite weakness during the last week of the month the S&P 500 and other indexes posted a solid month led by optimism surrounding Artificial Intelligence and technology-related names. All sectors posted gains during the month apart from energy-related names.

We continue to focus on companies that we believe are benefiting from long durable tailwinds which in turn should lead to higher revenues and earnings independent of rates. Inflation continues to be a drag on numerous business models, and we believe it is imperative that companies have pricing power, defensible moats, and capable management teams.

Considering higher valuation levels relative to a year ago, we are starting to increase our position sizes in more idiosyncratic opportunities such as spin-offs, mergers, and corporate transformation stories that we believe can generate returns with less sensitivity to inflation and the macro landscape.

On the inverse, we remain skeptical of companies that we believe have poor pricing power in an environment where inflation appears to be sticky for many input costs on the short side. The short side is likely to be a large driver of returns for the remainder of the year relative to the past several quarters, in our view.

The index is designed to measure the performance of the small-capitalization sector of the US equity market.
